(C) 3615-90	⅓ yard
(D) 3616-66	⅓ yard*
(E) 3616-90	¼ yard
(F) 3619-90	½ yard
Backing	
3615-66	3 yards

Batting 48" x 56" Piecing and sewing thread Quilting and sewing supplies

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# **Cutting**

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

WOF= Width of Fabric • LOF = Length of Fabric

Note: Lime Version fabrics listed second.

# Fabric A (3620-77 Dotty Stripe - Blue)

(3620-90 Dotty Stripe – Gray), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (80) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x 40 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 34 ½" WOF strips.

#### Fabric B (3618-77 Small Rectangle Geo - Blue)

(3618-90 Small Rectangle Geo - Gray), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (40) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric C (3615-77 Large Floral - Blue)

(3615-90 Large Floral - Gray), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (35) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 3 ½" x 42 ½" strips.
- (2) 3 ½" x 40 ½" strips.

#### Fabric D (3616-88 Vine Floral – Red)

(3616-66 Vine Floral – Lime), cut:

- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (70) 2 ½" squares.
- (5)  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

#### **Fabric E (3616-77 Vine Floral - Blue)**

(3616-90 Vine Floral – Gray), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (32) 2 ½" squares.

#### Fabric F (3619-77 Tone on Tone - Blue)

(3619-90 Tone on Tone - Gray), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub-cut (28) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x 38 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.

#### **Backing (3615-90 Large Floral - Gray)**

(3615-66 Large Floral - Lime), cut:

• (2) 48" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 48" x 56" for the back.

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Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

### **Row Assembly**





Fig. 1



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

#### (Follow Figure 1 while assembling rows.)

- 1. Sew (8) 2 ½" Fabric A squares, (4) 2 ½" Fabric B squares and (3) 2 ½" Fabric D squares together to make Row One. Repeat to make Rows Three, Five, Seven, Nine, Eleven, Thirteen, Fifteen, Seventeen and Nineteen.
- 2. Sew (8) 2 ½" Fabric D squares and (7) 2 ½" Fabric C squares together, alternating them, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Rows Six, Ten, Fourteen and Eighteen.
- 3. Sew (8) 2 ½" Fabric E squares and (7) 2 ½" Fabric F squares together, alternating them, to make Row Four. Repeat to make Rows Eight, Twelve and Sixteen.
- 4. Sew the (19) rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block.

#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

#### (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 5. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 38  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 32  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 6. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 34  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 7. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $42\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

## Layering, Quilting and Finishing

8. Press the quilt top and 48" x 56" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

### **Binding**

- 9. Cut the ends of the (5) Fabric D binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.
- 10. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
